## From Our Pastor:

This Sunday, June 3, we celebrate the Solemnity of *Corpus Christi* (the Body and Blood of Christ). Pope Francis regularly reminds Catholic Christians worldwide that the Holy Eucharist is central to our life – it is a moment of true Communion with the Lord, and with our brothers and sisters who share at the Lord's altar. The pope has said that when we're adoring Jesus Christ truly and substantially present in the Eucharist, we can allow ourselves to be transformed by Him (Homily, May 30, 2013). Please remember that we have nearly 24 hours of Solemn Exposition and Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament on First Fridays after the 8:15am Mass at Saint Clement until 8am on Saturday (with Solemn Benediction before the Saturday 8:15am Mass).

Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI has said that the Solemnity of *Corpus Christi* invites us "to contemplate the supreme Master of our faith: the Blessed Eucharist, the Real Presence of the Lord Jesus Christ in the Sacrament of the altar... Each time a priest repeats the Eucharistic sacrifice, he lends his voice, hands and heart to Christ, Who wished to remain with us and to be the pulsating heart of the Church. Even after the celebration of the divine mysteries, the Lord Jesus remains living in the tabernacle; because of this He is praised, especially by Eucharistic adoration" (*Angelus* address, June 10, 2007). "There is an intrinsic connection between celebration and adoration. The Holy Mass, in fact, is in itself the Church's greatest act of adoration. Adoration outside Holy Mass prolongs and intensifies what happened in the liturgical celebration and renders a true and profound reception of Christ possible."

Jesus and His Church have taught us from the beginning that the Eucharist is Jesus Christ Himself, body, blood, soul and divinity, truly, really and *substantially*; His glorified Body and Blood; the source and summit of our very life (Catechism of the Catholic Church #1322-ff; John 6; Matthew 26:26-30; Mark 14:22-26; Luke 22:14-20: 1 Corinthians 11:17-34). In the awesome gift of the Eucharist, Holy Communion, Jesus gives us His joy and love, and His strength to fulfill our life's mission. As Saint Teresa of Calcutta has said, the Eucharist "is the spiritual food that sustains me – without which I could not get through one single day or hour in my life." Her order, the Missionaries of Charity, with all the work that they do, draw their strength from the Lord in His Mass and in Eucharistic adoration *every day*.

"In life today, which is often noisy and scattered," Pope Emeritus Benedict has said, "it is more important than ever to recover the capacity for interior silence and recollection: Eucharistic adoration permits one to do this not only within one's 'I' but rather in the company of that 'You' full of love who is Jesus Christ, 'God, who is near us.' May the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of the Eucharist, lead us into the secret of true adoration. Her heart, humble and silent, was always recollected around the mystery of Jesus, in whom she worshipped the presence of God and His redemptive love."


## “FORMED” PICK OF THE WEEK!

With Memorial Day occurring last week, we recommend the film “*The Miracle of Fr. Kapaun*.” Fr. Emil Kapaun was a remarkable man, priest and soldier, who served as a U.S. Army chaplain during the Korean War. The 45 minute film tells his story of bravery, service and holiness, as well as the miracle attributed to his intercession. Fr. Kapaun was posthumously awarded the Medal of Honor and his cause for canonization is currently underway. To find this film easily, we have included it in the Community section of FORMED.

## THE PARISH DIRECTORIES ARE HERE!

Yes, you did read that right. The long-awaited 2017 St. Clement Parish Directories have arrived and are available on tables in the entrance of the church. Each family that had their photo taken, or who submitted a photo, automatically receives a directory. We have put name labels on each directory of those who get a free copy. You can also purchase a directory. The cost is just \$10. You can get yours by stopping by the parish office during normal office hours.



This directory is very simple. It includes a few introductory pages, those who had their photos taken and the submitted family pictures, and concludes with the parish roster. It will seem smaller than most of our previous directories for a few reasons. We only had 198 photos taken (which meant we could not get a hard cover on the directory – we needed 200 for this feature), and we had 27 submitted photos. We didn’t receive many photos of activities in the parish (only two areas of parish life sent photos, so we decided not to include any parish activities), so this also reduced the overall pages of the directory. So with the total number of families in the directory being fewer than in the past, only a few introductory pages, and the spiral bound cover which is thinner than one that is hard bound, all of this combined to make this directory smaller. We will say, though, that the spiral bound cover does make it much easier to lay the directory flat! In spite of the directory’s limitations, the new parish directory does help us know one another a bit better, which is its primary purpose. We hope you will find it useful in putting names to faces.

We apologize for getting this directory to you so late. It is not Lifetouch’s fault. They were very helpful in the process. Much of the delay was on our end for various reasons along the way. For that we are sorry, and ask your forgiveness and understanding.

Because of the delay in finishing the directory, we discovered how quickly things change within families. Many of you will notice some of these changes when you begin paging through the directory. We’ve had parishioners die, move, get married, have children, and so forth since the directory photos were taken almost a year ago. To help better reflect the families in our parish, and for all of us to know each other more, we will, in all likelihood, do another directory in 5-6 years.

We also realize that we may have made errors in the roster section of the directory. We submitted to Lifetouch the information that we had in our parish data base. Sometimes we do not know if there have been changes within families, such as a marriage, a divorce, a move and so on. If you do see an error, we apologize and we ask that you please contact the parish office so that we can update our information. We do want to keep our parish family information as current as possible, and you can help us to do that.


## SAINT CLEMENT SCHOOL
