From Our Pastor:

During the forty days between Easter Sunday and the Ascension of Our Lord, the Church encourages us in an especially focused way to keep our eyes on Heaven, our ultimate purpose in life, to which Our Lord Jesus Christ is calling us. This focus becomes more intense as we approach Ascension Thursday, the celebration of Jesus, God the Son, ascending into Heaven, to the right hand of God the Father (in the Diocese of Madison and some other dioceses, the celebration of Ascension Thursday, May 18 this year, is transferred to Sunday, May 21).

Before His Ascension into Heaven, Jesus Christ promised His disciples that He would be with them forever (John 14:19-20; Matthew 28:20) – and He has kept His promise in His Church, Word and Sacraments. Indeed, at every Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, Our Lord gives us Himself in His glorified Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity, re-presenting to us His one Passion, Death and Resurrection, reminding us that He has prepared a place for us in His Father's House (John 14:2-3), that on the Last Day, God will raise our mortal bodies to be like His own, in glory, reuniting our body and soul in Heaven (John 6; 2 Corinthians 4-5). This is our Faith and Hope that God has given us, which we proclaim at Mass and when we say the Apostles' Creed and Nicene Creed, stating that we believe in and look forward to the resurrection of the body and eternal life in Heaven.

As disciples of Jesus Christ, may we always be inspired and comforted by the hope of Heaven, realizing that Jesus strengthens us for the journey by His grace given through His Church, Word and Sacraments, especially in the Holy Eucharist, where Jesus is truly, really and substantially present - therefore, we have a duty to keep inviting and encouraging our families and friends to return to the heart of our faith, Jesus Christ and His gift of the Mass. Thanks be to God that He continues to guide and direct His Church through His Holy Spirit (John 14:23-29), along with His gifts of prayer, Sacred Scripture, Sacred Tradition, and His teaching authority, the Magisterium. As Jesus has reminded us through His Church, our fundamental duty as His disciples is to follow the Lord, to keep His Commandments, to love Him with all our heart, mind and strength, and our neighbor as ourselves, and help as many people as possible to do the same. Jesus Christ is our Hope and He calls us to proclaim the Truth with Love in a world where evil-doers are increasingly hostile toward God and His Church as they reject His basic teachings on life, marriage and the family - so let's keep praying for the conversion of all evil-doers, to conquer them with all that is good, beautiful and true (Romans 12:21). Meditating on Heaven helps us to love God and neighbor as He has loved us – a love that transforms everything we say and do, even the most mundane moments, realizing that God the Father, Son and Holy Spirit is present at every moment, as He sanctifies our words and deeds, calling us to live evermore deeply in His love, peace and joy, evermore aware that He is with us, always.

As we celebrate Mother's Day this Sunday, May 14, may we always thank God for all our moms, living and deceased, and ask Jesus Christ's mother, the Blessed Virgin Mary, the first and perfect disciple of Jesus, to pray for us – may she help us to pray and to be faithful, hopeful and loving Catholic Christian disciples, in closer communion with her Son, Jesus Christ, the Only Savior of the world. Amen. Alleluia!

Dear Parishioners of Pastorate #1:

My name is Fr. Steve Brunner, and I will be your new "Parochial Administrator!" Parochial Administrator is a big title that essentially means "Pastor," but it is often used in situations where there is a change in leadership. I am excited to come to your church, along with Fr. Mark and Fr. Sudhakar, and to teach you the Catholic faith and to deepen your personal relationship with Jesus Christ. In this bulletin letter, I'd like to introduce myself and tell you more about my story.

I grew up in Yardley, Pennsylvania, which is a small town outside of Philadelphia. I grew up there with my two brothers Greg and Matt. I am 37 years old, Greg is 40, and Matt is 42.
