

From Our Pastor:

Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ calls us every day to experience a spiritual renewal in our life, to be His faithful, hopeful and loving disciples. These gifts of faith, hope and love that come from God the Father, Son and Holy Spirit, lead us to communion with Him. In the free will that God gives us, we either embrace or reject these gifts from God who is love (1 John 4), for He will not force us to live them. Remarkably, when we say "yes" to Jesus and embrace His saving grace with faith, prayerfully turning to the Lord in His Church, Word and Sacraments, committed to conversion, we can experience His renewing love, hope, joy, peace, goodness and beauty! Faith is an adherence to God as His sons and daughters "beyond what we feel and understand" (Catechism of the Catholic Church #2609). Conversely, when people are not being faithful, hopeful and loving disciples of Jesus Christ, the results are much of the troubles and evils we see in the world today - as people reject the Good Shepherd and His teachings on life, marriage and the family, they openly advocate abortion and the mutilation and trafficking of children (a record 250,000 unaccompanied children illegally crossed our U.S. southern border in the last two years; current federal elected and non-elected officials cannot locate nearly half of them). Nonetheless, in His love for us, Jesus Christ keeps calling us to conversion, to turn away from our sinfulness and be faithful to the Gospel as He consoles and counsels us this Sunday: "Do not let your hearts be troubled. You have faith in God ... " and therefore love and follow Him because He is "the Way, the Truth and the Life" (John 14:1-12).

When we're faithful, hopeful and loving Christian disciples, we experience communion with the Lord Jesus and we do the opus Dei (work of God), aware that God has prepared for us a dwelling in Heaven if we, by His grace, follow Him (John 14). We do this when we pray daily and go to Mass on Sundays (third Commandment), crying out like the Apostles, "Increase our faith, Lord!" (Luke 17:5), embracing God's saving grace with faith, asking Him to help us to live the faith that we profess, to be His instruments of love and mercy, for we need God's help, His grace, every day in order to pray, to proclaim the Truth with love, to keep His Commandments (Ephesians 4; John 14:15; 15:1-17), and stay close to Him in His Church, Word and Sacraments, especially in the Holy Eucharist (thanks be to God that 18 of our children made their First Holy Communion last Sunday). When we follow Jesus Christ, we do not settle for compromise or mediocrity, for Jesus is not an opinion or feeling - rather, He is the Way, the Truth and the Life (John 14:6). Apart from Him, we can do nothing good, because He is the source of all that is good, beautiful and true. Adherence to Jesus Christ ensures that where He is we too will be, by His grace, unto the ultimate Communion with Him and the Father and the Holy Spirit in eternal life in Heaven.

As we prepare to celebrate Mother's Day on May 14, thanking God for all our moms, living and deceased, let us ask Jesus Christ's mother, the Blessed Virgin Mary, the first and perfect disciple of Jesus, to pray for us - may she help us to pray and to be faithful, hopeful and loving Catholic Christian disciples, in closer communion with her Son, Jesus Christ, the Only Savior of the world. Amen. Alleluia.
