
GRANT CO. RIGHT TO LIFE TALK

SAINT OF THE WEEK

Last Friday, September 8, was the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary. We know from Tradition that her parents were Joachim and Anne, who were both elderly when she was conceived. By God's special grace, Mary was conceived in her mother's womb without Original Sin that she might be pure and free from sin in order to be the Mother of our Savior. We celebrate this on the Feast of the Immaculate Conception. When the archangel Gabriel came to her at the Annunciation, he addresses her not by her name, but what/who she is: "Full of grace." The Blessed Virgin Mary was the first person since Adam and Eve to be filled with the fullness and immensity of God's grace flowing through her. Our first parents lost this through their choice to sin. Mary, though, throughout her life, remained sinless with the help of God. She had free-will, as we do, but she always chose to do God's will, even in those times when she did not understand. It was then that she trusted in God. Mary, at the end of her life, was Assumed into Heaven, a feast we just celebrated on August 15. As Jesus honored His Mother, we also honor the Blessed Virgin Mary.
